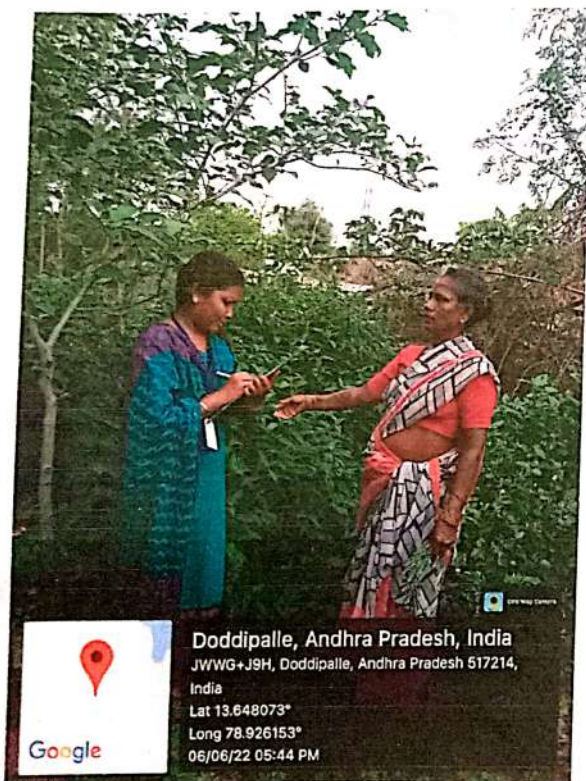
## METHODOLOGY

**Principle I** - *Disease is a malfunctioning of a plant, which results from a continuous irritant by a pathogenic agent.*

**Principle II** - *Disease results from an interaction of the virulence of the pathogen, susceptibility of the host, and the conduciveness of the environment.*



**Principle III** - *Conditions which favor plant growth and health commonly favor disease.*

**Principle IV** - *Overwatering and under watering plants both exacerbate disease.*

**Principle V** - *The realistic way to manage plant disease is through an integrated management strategy that includes: 1) cultural practices, 2) epidemiology, 3) resistant varieties, 4) chemical pesticides, and 5) biological control.*

**Principle VI** - *A major approach to disease control is inoculum reduction.*

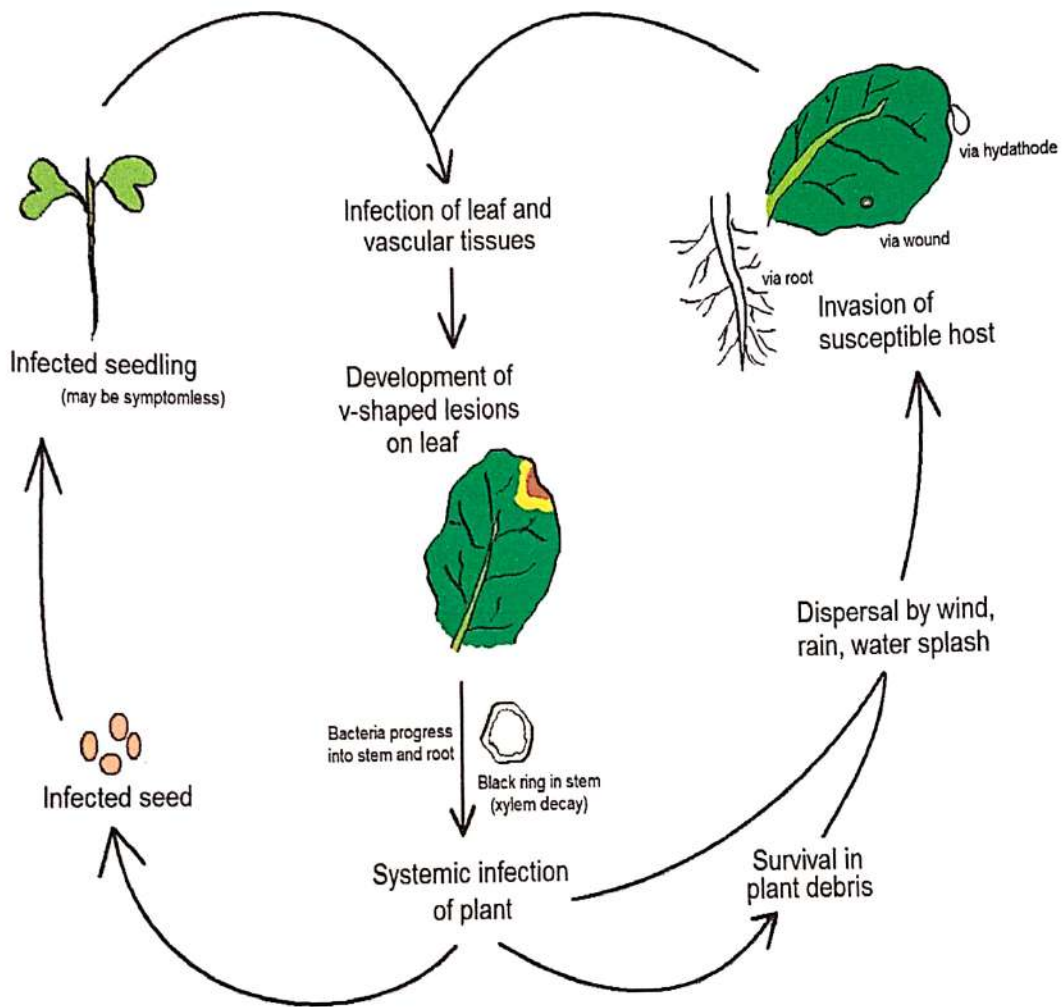
**Principle VII** - *Wood decay organisms result in wind damage and breakage in trees*

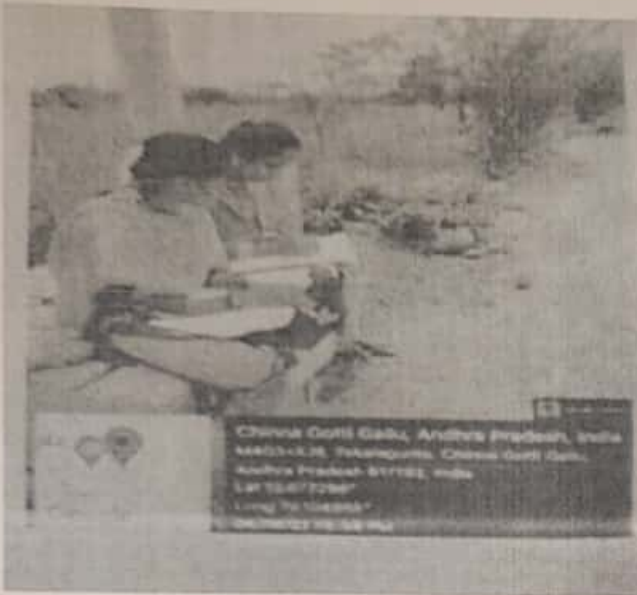

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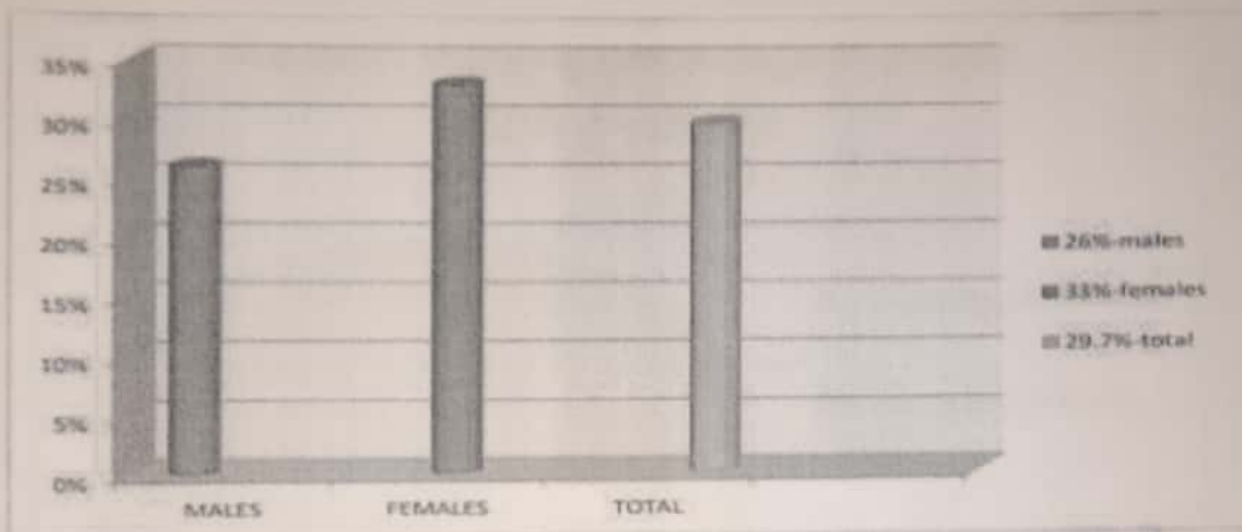

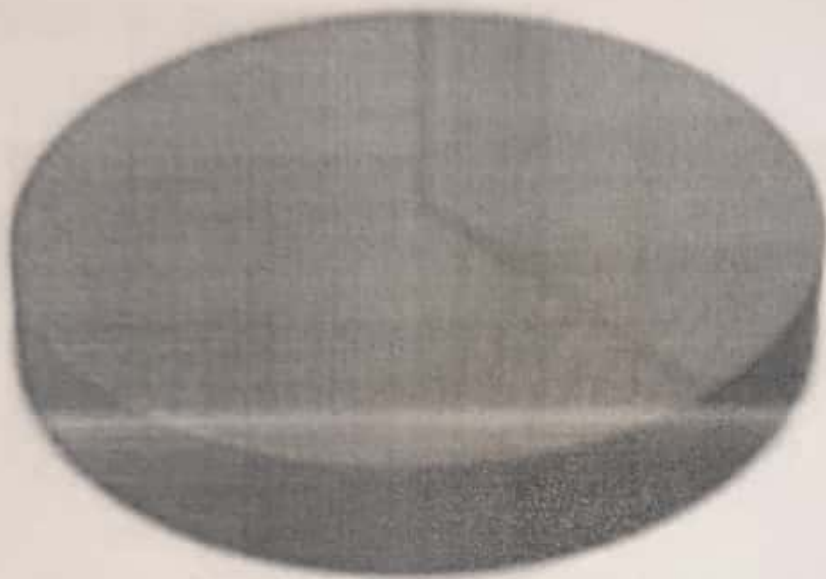

- About 38.88% people are using vehicles, and 61.11% people are not having any of the vehicles.

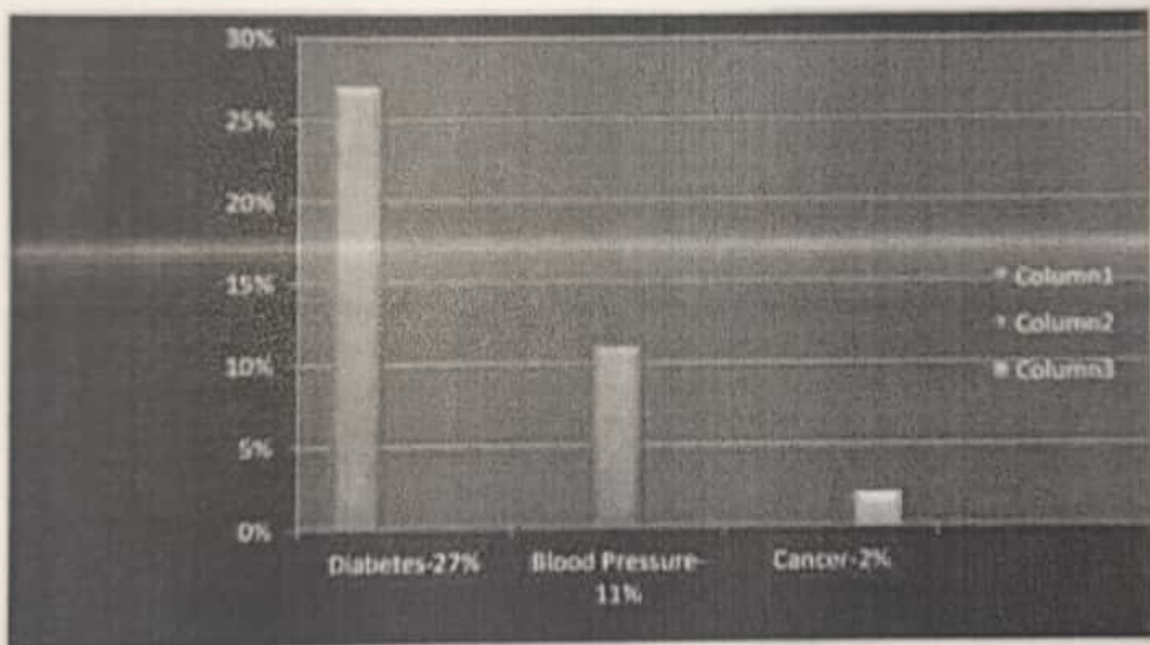
## Pie chart showing percentage of people having vehicles

## ABOUT FSSAI

The Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) has been established under Food Safety and Standards, 2006 which consolidates various acts & orders that have hitherto handled food related issues in various Ministries and Departments. FSSAI has been created for laying down science based standards for articles of food and to regulate their manufacture, storage, distribution, sale and import to ensure availability of safe and wholesome food for human consumption.

### **Highlights of the Food Safety and Standard Act, 2006**

- Various central Acts like Prevention of Food Adulteration Act, 1954, Fruit Products Order, 1955, Meat Food Products Order, 1973,
- Vegetable Oil Products (Control) Order, 1947, Edible Oils Packaging (Regulation) Order 1988, Solvent Extracted Oil, De- Oiled Meal and Edible Flour (Control) Order, 1967, Milk and Milk Products Order, 1992 etc will be repealed after commencement of FSS Act, 2006.

The Act also aims to establish a single reference point for all matters relating to food safety and standards, by moving from multi- level, multi- departmental control to a single line of command. To this effect, the Act establishes an independent statutory Authority – the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India with head office at Delhi. Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) and the State Food Safety Authorities shall enforce various provisions of the Act.

### **Establishment of the Authority**

Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India is the Administrative Ministry for the implementation of FSSAI. The Chairperson and Chief Executive Officer of Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) have already been appointed by Government of India. The Chairperson is in the rank of Secretary to Government of India.

### **FSSAI has been mandated by the FSS Act, 2006 for performing the following functions:**

- Framing of Regulations to lay down the Standards and guidelines in relation to articles of food and specifying appropriate system of enforcing various standards thus notified.
- Laying down mechanisms and guidelines for accreditation of certification bodies engaged in certification of food safety management system for food businesses.
- Laying down procedure and guidelines for accreditation of laboratories and notification of the accredited laboratories.
- To provide scientific advice and technical support to Central Government and State Governments in the matters of framing the policy and rules in areas which have a direct or indirect bearing of food safety and nutrition.
- Collect and collate data regarding food consumption, incidence and prevalence of biological risk, contaminants in food, residues of various, and contaminants in foods products, identification of emerging risks and introduction of rapid alert system.
- Creating an information network across the country so that the public, consumers, Panchayats, etc receive rapid, reliable and objective information about food safety and issues of concern.

## PREFACE

Adulteration is the act of degrading food quality by incidental or intentional means through the addition of chemicals, extraneous matter, etc. In a country like India where there is a huge population to feed and there is lack of monitoring of what reaches the consumer, the act of adulteration isn't quite surprising. Items of daily consumption like grains and milk, etc are found to be adulterated much to our disregard.

Food adulteration is done for the selfish interest of food vendors for monetary gains and not only compromises on the health of the consumer but also results in wastage of food which are discarded if found adulterated. The country which faces a gap in the supply and demand goes several steps back again due to this. Quite unknowingly, most of the times, the food vendors indulge into such malpractices with callous disregard to the health interests of the consumer by all possible means.

Food safety is an aim to bring safe and nutritious food to the plate of the consumer. Hence the prime objective of food is not sufficed due to the menace created by food adulteration.

Though with implementation of the FSS act (2006), there has been nationwide campaigning against food adulteration and penalizations have been declared who violate those standards. FSSAI has also campaigned for consumer awareness regarding food adulteration and has given resources like the DART Book which will help them to detect food adulteration at home. It is trying its level best to identify the roots of this menace. Well, but added that only detection of food adulteration is one side of the coin, it must be made sure that the sources of such adulterants are also identified and penalized.

Still there are a huge number of products, both packaged and unpackaged that are found adulterated by food laboratories and those foods go into waste as they are unfit for consumption. Thus, in this way, the food grown by the farmer by use of a multitude of resources doesn't reach the consumer or makes way to his plate as a poison. This is a clear case of food wastage and violation of the interests of the consumer who pays for the product as well the farmers who work hard to grow the crop. In a country of 1.3 billion people and where a massive chunk of the population struggles to get two square meals a day and remains unfed there a large proportion of food grains produced ends up in the bin, it is ironical how such a situation has now become a reality. Unfortunately, it is the middlemen who finally earn profit from such heinous acts.

Thus, there stands a need to take a strict control over the food items sold to the consumer and also address the major causes behind food adulteration so that it can be brought down to nil and instead there is protection given to the customer in terms of provision of safe foods. Not to disregard, that such efforts will also alleviate food adulteration and prevent food wastage.

This project aims at bringing out the answers to the following questions:

- what are the basic reasons behind why food samples are found non-compliant to FSSAI guidelines,

- What are the routes of food adulteration seen in the country ,
- What are the reasons behind food adulteration
- And finally it focuses on the remedies to the problem of food adulteration after detailed cause analysis
- One unattended aspect of the impact of food adulteration is that it also leads to food wastage as the non-compliant samples are unfit for human consumption. Even though a lot of resources go into the production of such grains, still they find their way into the bin.
- In addition to this, through this project, we take in account of what has been done by the countries around the globe to prevent food adulteration and take lessons on how we can address the problem of adulteration in a more advanced way.

## METHOD OF STUDY

The project is developed on the qualitative and quantitative analysis based on FSSAI rules

Then cause analysis of the data was conducted to figure out the reasons underlying the cases of non-compliance of food samples. In detail probing into adulteration of each food item was conducted and function of each adulterant and the reasons behind the use was also stipulated.

The cause analysis helped to find out the gaps in the existing system of prevention of food adulteration. After this, with each gap was addressed with a different approach keeping in mind the least involvement of manpower and making the food supply system more transparent and least loop holes.

The study brings about the good aspects of food adulteration laws of countries around the globe and what from those laws can be adopted into the food adulteration laws of India.

## WAYS TO PREVENT FOOD ADULTERATION

### A REMEDY FOR THE MENACE NAMED "FOOD ADULTERATION"

Through the detailed cause analysis, various reasons behind the adulteration of food were revealed. The major problems seen in this sector are related to and the possible remedies to them are as follows:

#### 1. Improved Storage facilities

One of the biggest problems seen in the food grains, legumes and spices is insect infestation due to the humid and unhygienic conditions of the store house.

Remedy proposed: we need close monitoring of the storage conditions of food grains by professional individuals

There is a scope to improve the quality of grains by keeping in track the incoming and outgoing samples along with their dates so that "first in first out" can be applied here as well.

Additional care must be given to check that insect infested grains from the fields do not reach the storehouse as it might turn out to be threat for the healthy grains.

During the months of monsoon, and also in highly humid areas, extra care must be taken so that grains are not spoiled.

#### 2. Improved Handling practices

The food handlers have to be well trained on how to handle grains to prevent damage to the grains or quality loss.

#### 3. Prevention of Addition of extraneous matter, other oils, rice starch and other substances for monetary gains by selling cheaper quality food at a higher price

Economically motivated food adulteration is widespread in our country. This can be handled in a three-fold technique by joint efforts of the consumer, food vendor and the government.

First, the consumer should be encouraged keep a keen eye on the food they are buying or consuming. The DART book must be popularized among the public through advertisements and housewives can be motivated to conduct those tests. The public must be taught to any slightest of the cases of food adulteration that they encounter. All such efforts will be possible only if the consumer knows the ill-effects of consuming adulterated food.

Second, the FOSTAC training must be given to the food vendors so as to educate them about the ill effects of adulterated food, inform them about the penalties they have to pay if found guilty and therefore encourage them to carry out fair trade practices.

Third, the government can open "adulteration awareness cells" where people can report cases of food adulteration directly. The government can also conduct raids or sudden visits to the godown or places where food is stored so as to check if the conditions are suitable. Random sampling of foods from different vendors should be analyzed and if found adulterated then strict measures must be taken.

**4. Introduction of newer technologies for detection of food adulteration:**

Food apps should be developed such that consumers can easily report cases of food adulteration.

Newer machines can be developed to detect the level of food adulteration in different food items.

For example, 'Ksheer Scanner', which instantaneously detects urea, salt, detergent, liquid soap, boric acid, caustic soda, soda and hydrogen peroxide, was developed by CSIR-CEERI. Such improved machinery will help to efficient detection of food adulteration.

Development of well-developed laboratories with developed equipments for carrying out advanced detection techniques for food adulteration

**5. Encouraging food vendors who are found to be fair:**

The food vendors who are found to sell good quality foods must be rewarded in various ways so that the others are motivated to sell good quality products.

Positive motivation can act better than penalizations and prosecutions.

**6. Education to food vendors and all middle men:**

The food vendors must be given training and told about the ill effects of adulteration. They must be made aware that the adulterated foods also harm their own family members.

## LESSONS FROM AROUND THE GLOBE ON THEY HAVE FOUGHT FOOD ADULTERATION

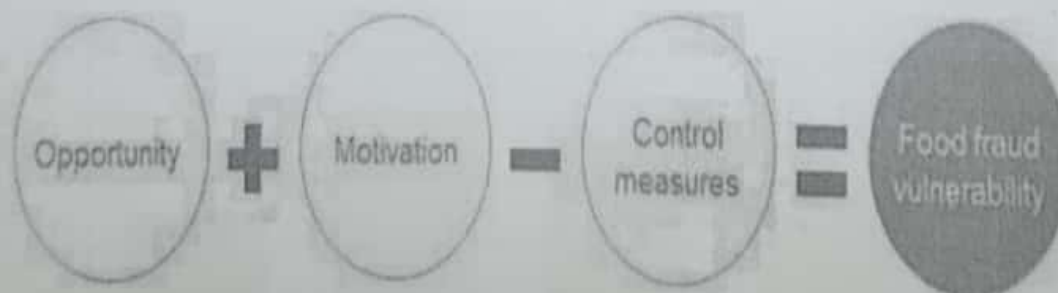
### • FDA PROTECTS THE FOOD SUPPLY FROM INTENTIONAL ADULTERATION

First, facilities must conduct a vulnerability assessment, which means finding the points in their processes that pose the greatest risk for intentional adulteration. Second, facilities must put in place mitigation, or preventive, strategies to address these vulnerabilities. Third, a system must be put in place for food defense monitoring, food defense corrective action, and food defense verification, which together ensure the system is working as intended to address the vulnerabilities. Fourth is recordkeeping. Finally, there are training requirements. Personnel, and their supervisors, working at the most vulnerable points in a facility are required to take food defense awareness training and to have the education, training, or experience to properly implement mitigation strategies. In addition, preparing the food defense plan, conducting vulnerability assessments, identifying mitigation strategies, and engaging in reanalysis activities must be done or overseen by personnel with additional training or experience.

Their main aim they have is to "educate and regulate".

### • PwC HONG KONG'S MEASURES TO PREVENT FOOD

PwC, in cooperation with SSAFE, Wageningen University and the Vrije Universiteit of Amsterdam has launched a food fraud vulnerability assessment tool that helps companies analyse these three aspects in order to better understand the food fraud vulnerability for any food product or ingredient.



**Opportunity:** The opportunity to commit fraud reflects the ease of adulteration and difficulty of detection. For a food ingredients, these are determined by composition, physical qualities, complexity of production processes, control of supply chains, as well a geographic origins.

**Motivation:** High value food items for which subtle characteristics create large price differences can be enticing targets for fraudsters. Intense price competition creates incentives to replace high value ingredients with cheap substitutes. A company with a valuable brand is usually less motivated to commit fraud, while the motivation to commit economic crimes is often higher when a company or an individual is facing a financially desperate situation.

**Control Measures:** A food company's primary fraud controls are its food safety management and quality control systems, as well as its managers and staff. External controls include food safety agencies, anti-fraud regulations and law enforcement. Vigilant suppliers also play a role in preventing food fraud.

• **AUSTRALIA'S FIGHT WITH FOOD ADULTERATION:**

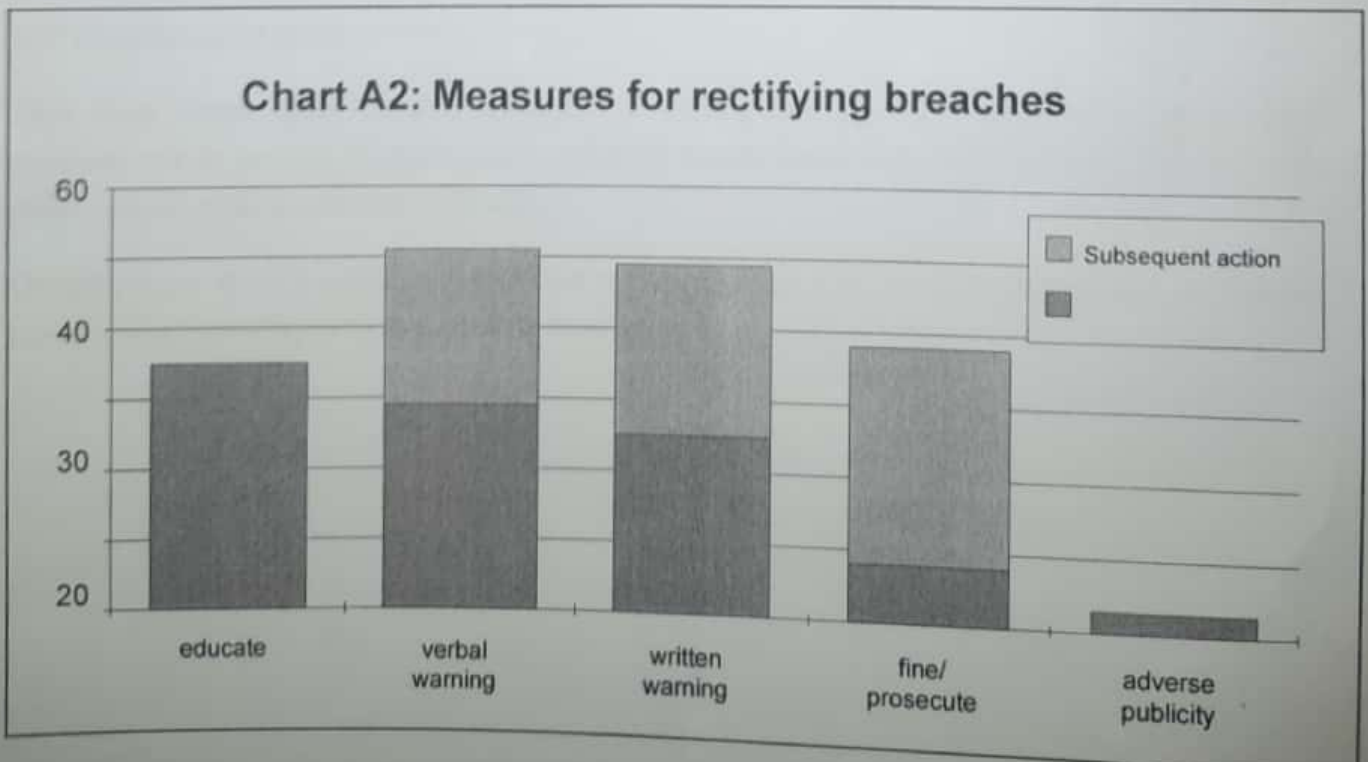
Inspection and surveillance are the most common bases of identifying specific breaches of food laws. Further survey data indicates that, in conducting inspection programs, most agencies undertake systematic rather than random inspections; inspection frequency is in most cases weighted according to the assessed risk involved in particular classes of premises; and general inspections patterns are preferred to blitzes on particular areas or problems.

Public complaints received a lower rating as a means of identifying specific breaches, but this reflects limits on the number of complaints received rather than the importance attached to them by the agencies. Indeed, 84 percent of agencies indicated that they give priority to public complaints, reflecting underlying notions of 'customer service' in many cases.

The table shows that education and warnings are the most commonly used tools for rectifying specific breaches and are often used together. On identifying a breach, an enforcement officer will often issue a warning and also advise the proprietor on how to deal with the problem.

Fines and prosecutions are used less frequently, and adverse publicity is rarely used.

Further breakdown of the survey data demonstrates that the agencies generally take a graduated approach to rectifying breaches. In terms of warnings, verbal warnings are more commonly used when a breach is first identified, whereas written warnings are favoured if no remedial action is taken by a proprietor following a first warning. Likewise, fining or prosecuting immediately after a breach is detected is rarely or never used. Indeed, only nine agencies indicated that they actually have the power to issue on-the-spot fines and survey responses indicate that it is rarely used in the first instance. However, the majority of agencies indicated that they would be willing to resort to fining or seeking prosecution if initial attempts to have problems rectified were to fail.

These graduated approaches are reflected in formal or informal hierarchies of measures. Nearly all agencies (47 out of 49) indicated that they do use a hierarchy of measures. Of those that do, most used an informal approach (29 out of 49) whilst the remainder have formal procedures.

Typically, the hierarchies used involve some or all of the following elements:

- education/advice on the nature of the problem and how to rectify it;
- a verbal warning is given;
- a written warning is issued;
- a formal clean-up notice is issued; and
- fines are imposed, prosecution commences, or closure orders are served.

If action on the first level of the hierarchy fails to bring about the desired results, the agencies will escalate up to the next level.

That said, some agencies also indicated a willingness to immediately use higher level mechanisms in certain circumstances, such as where fraud has occurred or where a major public health risk results from a breach.

Overall, these survey results suggest that agencies adopt a more cooperative than combative posture when dealing with breaches in food laws.

## CONCLUSION

The study brings out a clear picture of the present scenario of food adulteration in THATIGUNTAVARI PALLE. It also highlights the main areas on which the government should focus so that the menace of food adulteration can be put to control.

Through the cause analysis, it is clear that the major areas should focus on is to combat intentional food adulteration for economic benefits, as most of the cases of non-compliance were due to that. The ignorance and selfish interests of the middle class men have led them into such malpractices.

The key points that rose out of this study is as followed:

- Education and regulation go hand in hand.
- Prevention of food adulteration in turn prevents food wastage.
- Digitalization and improved technology can revolutionize the present scenario of food safety.

It requires close monitoring and strategic planning to combat such a widespread problem. But the boon at present is the rapid advancement of technology which can be utilized to against food adulteration. Food safety apps for consumers, improved labs under the government and trained personnel's for supervision will together form a great weapon to fight food adulteration.

## ABSTRACT:

There is fierce global competition within the banking industry. Therefore, banks endeavor to grow and strive to increase their market share. We analyzed the effect of developing innovative channels of presenting bank services on banks' market share. The statistical population of this research was HDFC bank's central headquarter and its branches in India, USA. We developed questionnaires for gathering the data. The validity and reliability of the scales were tested by EFA, CFA, experts' opinion. We used linear regression to assess the impact of innovative channels, including internet banking, automatic teller machines (ATMs), mobile banking, telephone banking (TB), and point of sales (POS) on banks' market share. The results indicated that some of these channels, including internet banking, POS, and TB, positively affect a bank's market share. The effect of two other platforms, including mobile banking and ATM development, on banks' market share was rejected. The findings of this study expand our understanding of how bank managers can improve their market share by developing innovative e-banking channels.

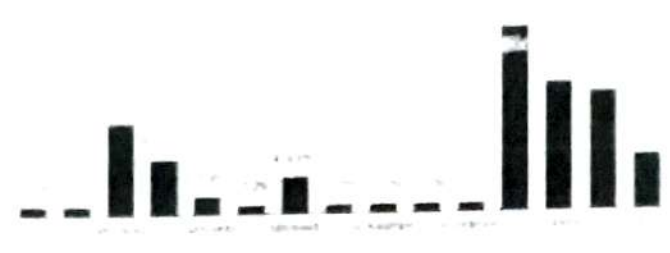
Fig. 2. Evidence of a drinking survey (2010-2015).

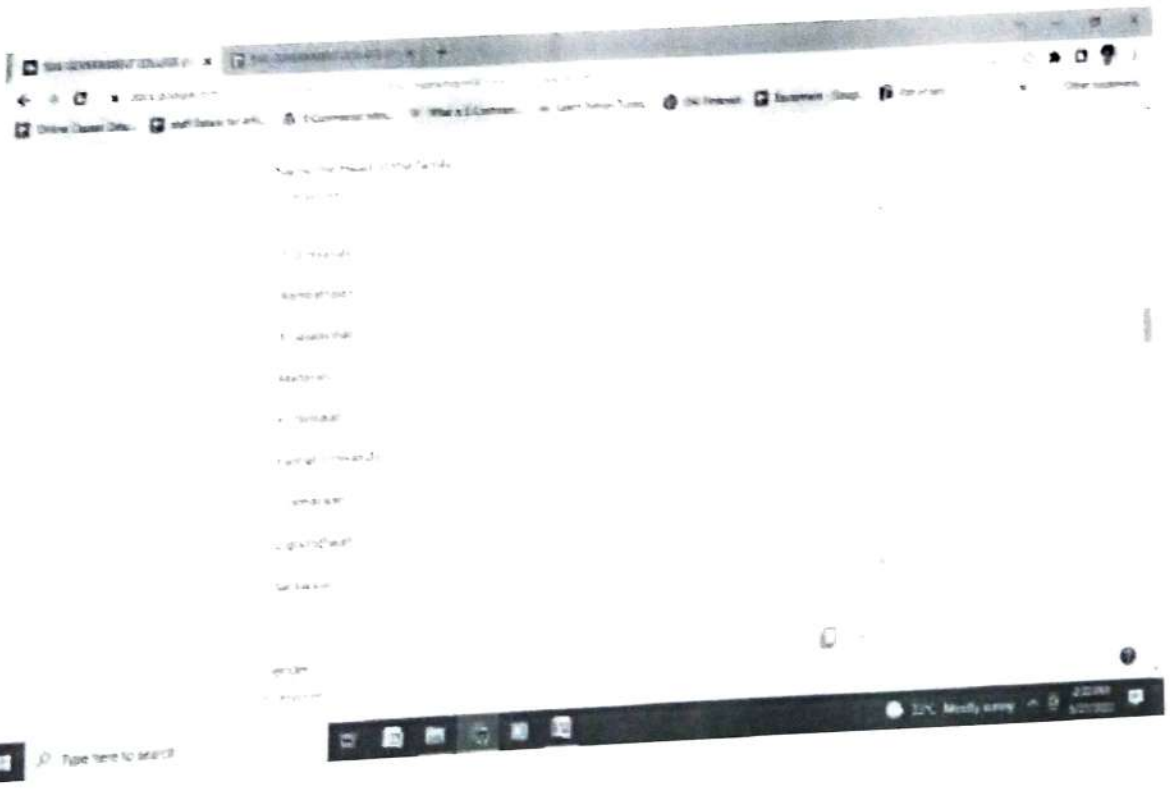
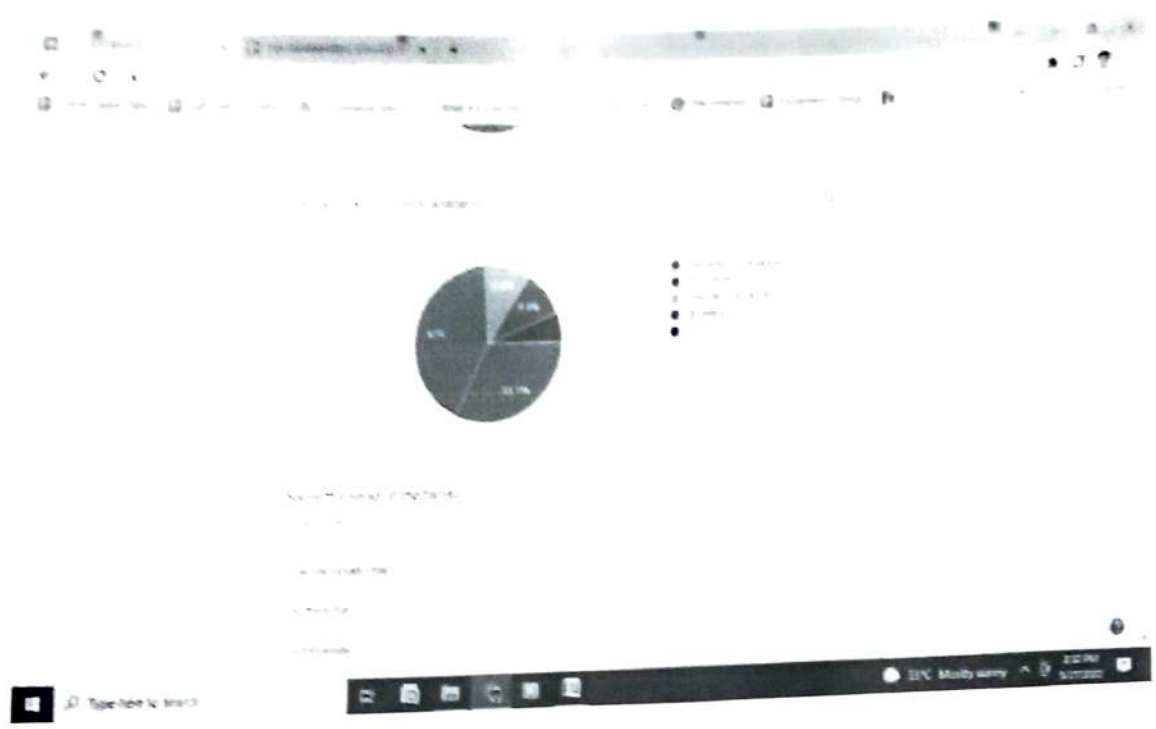

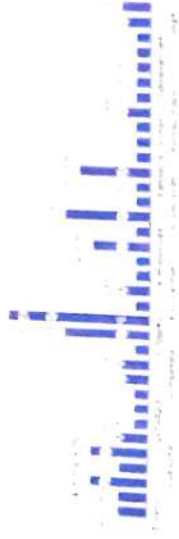


Figure 1: New Image

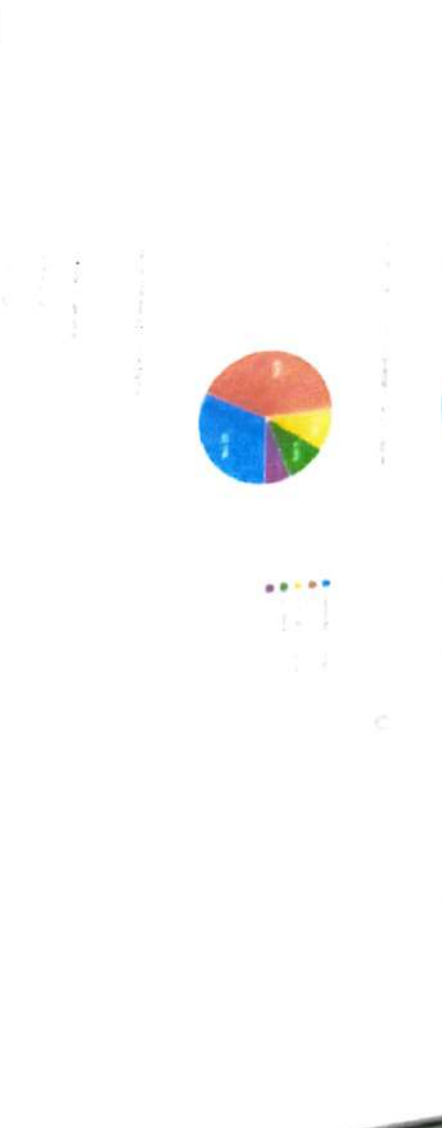

## Public Distribution System

roduction

The Government has always spoken about 'food security for all'. This is not surprising as endemic hunger continues to badly affect a large section of the Indian people. The International Food Policy Research Institute (IFPRI)'s Global Hunger Index (GHI) places India in the category of nations where hunger was 'alarming', ranking 66 out of the 88 developing countries. IFPRI estimate of the hunger index for the 17 major states in 2008 (more than 95 per cent of the population of India), put 12 into the 'alarming' category, and 5 into the 'extremely alarming' category. High levels of hunger are seen even in high growth states. Expectedly, the backward Eastern and Central region has the worst performance.

80 per cent of the rural population, 64 per cent of the urban population, and 76 per cent of the total population suffer from inadequate calorie and food consumption. More than half of India's women and three-quarters of children are anaemic, with incidence among pregnant women an even higher 59 per cent. The proportion of underweight children remains around 48 per cent for the past 20 years. 30 per cent infants have low birth weight. One in every three adult Indian has a body mass index (BMI) below 18.5 indicating chronic energy deficiency (CED). The obvious strategy to tackle hunger and malnutrition is to universalize and strengthen the Public Distribution System by making adequate food available at affordable prices.

Food availability and stability were considered good measures of food security till the seventies and the achievement of self-sufficiency was accorded high priority in the food policies of developing countries. At the national level, we have solved the problem of food security which is reflected in mounting buffer stocks. Though India was successful in achieving self-sufficiency by increasing its food production and also improved its capacity to cope with year-to-year fluctuations in food production, it could not solve the problem of chronic household food insecurity. The limitation is not food supply, but food distribution. Careful consideration of food security requires moving beyond food availability and recognizing the low incomes of the poor.

### Intervention of Public Distribution System

India is one of the few countries which have experimented with a broad spectrum of programmes for improving food security. Public distribution system evolved as a major

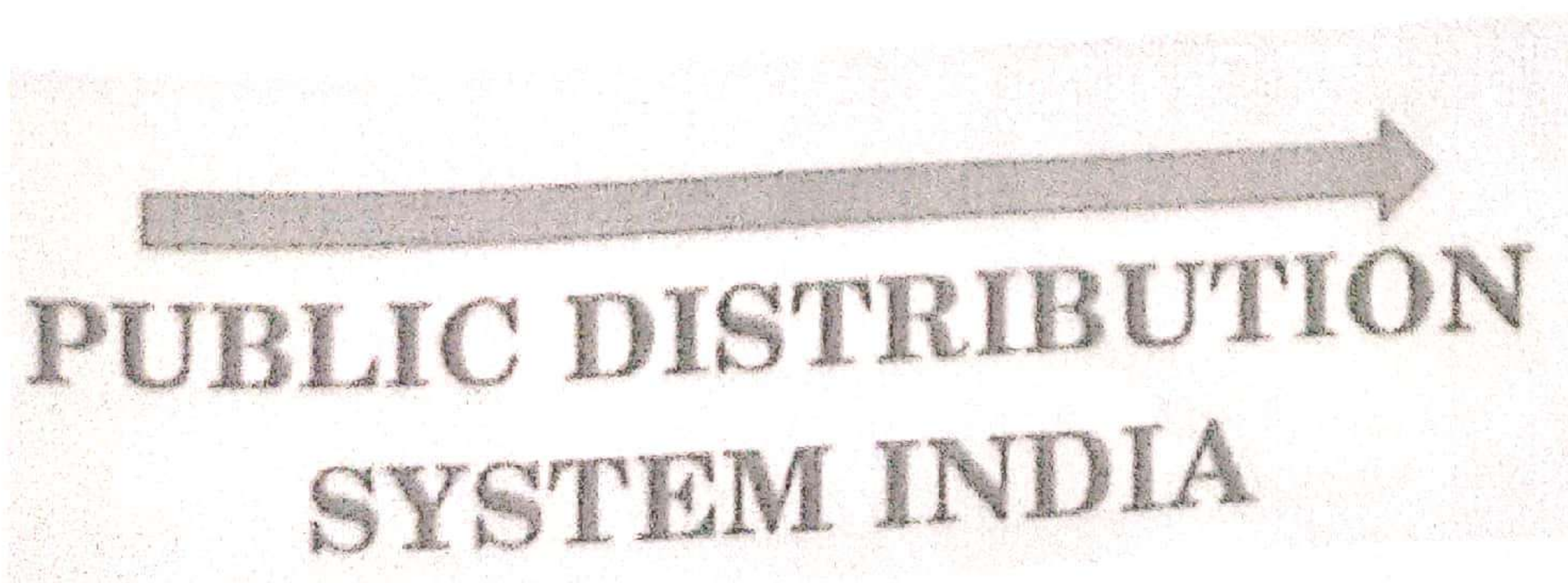
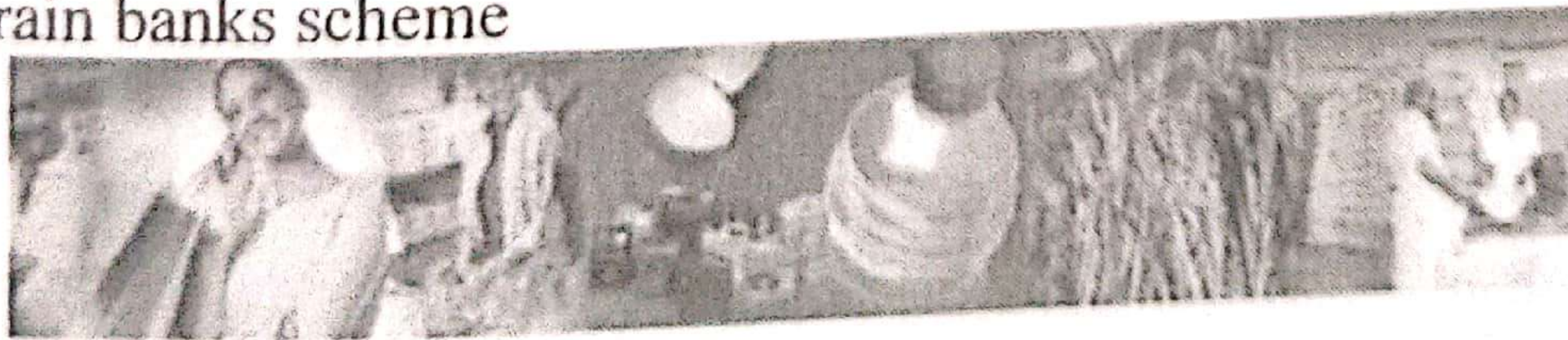
instrument of the government's economic policy for ensuring availability of food grains to the public at affordable prices as well as for enhancing the food security for the poor. Public distribution system means distribution of essential commodities to a large number of people through a network of fair price shops on a recurring basis. It is an important constituent of the strategy for poverty eradication and is intended to serve as a safety net for the poor whose number is more than 33 crores and are nutritionally at risk. It has a strong network of 4.99 lakhs fair price shops. It is the largest distribution network of its type in the world.

### Public Distribution System in India – Its Operational Mechanism

PDS is operated under the joint responsibility of the Central and the State governments. The Central Government has taken the responsibility for procurement, storage, transportation and bulk allocation of foodgrains, etc. The responsibility for distributing the same to the consumers through the network of Fair Price Shops (FPSs) rests with the State governments. The operational responsibilities including allocation within the State, identification of families below poverty line, issue of ration cards, supervision and monitoring the functioning of FPSs rest with the State government. Under the PDS, presently the commodities namely, wheat, rice, sugar and kerosene, are being allocated to the States/UTs for distribution. Some States/UTs also distribute additional items of mass consumption through the PDS outlets such as cloth, exercise books, pulses, salt and tea, etc.

The following schemes are available under public distribution system in India.

- Mid day meals scheme
- Wheat based nutrition programme
- Scheme for supply of food grains to sc/st/obc hostels/welfare institutions
- Annapurna scheme
- National programme for adolescent girls
- Emergency feeding programme
- Village grain banks scheme



## Evolution of Public Distribution System

The 1960s also marked the beginning of the Green Revolution. While it contributed significantly to the attainment of national food self-sufficiency, these gains were regionally biased in their spread. As a result, the achievement of local food security in the food-deficit regions and the growing urban regions came to depend significantly on external supplies from the food-surplus regions.

Public Distribution of essential commodities had been in existence in India during the post-war period. The PDS was established in the 1960s with the aim of (a) maintaining



stability in the prices of essential commodities across regions; (b) ensuring food entitlements to all sections at reasonable and affordable prices; and (c) keeping a check on private trade, hoarding and black-marketing. PDS, with its focus on distribution of food grains in urban scarcity areas, had emanated from the critical food shortages of 1960. PDS had substantially contributed to the containment of rise in food grains prices and ensured access of food to urban consumers. As the national agricultural production had grown in the aftermath of Green Revolution, the outreach of PDS was extended to tribal blocks and areas of high incidence of poverty in the 1970s and 1980s.

PDS, till 1992, was a general entitlement scheme for all consumers without any specific target. Revamped Public Distribution System (RPDS) was launched in June 1992 in 775 blocks throughout the country.

The Targeted Public Distribution System (TPDS) was introduced with effect from June 1997.

### Revamped Public Distribution System (RPDS)

The Revamped Public Distribution System (RPDS) was launched in June, 1992 with a view to strengthen and streamline the PDS as well as to improve its reach in the far-flung,

hilly, remote and inaccessible areas where a substantial section of the poor live. It covered 1775 blocks wherein area specific programmes such as the Drought Prone Area Programme (DPAP), Integrated Tribal Development Projects (ITDP), Desert Development Programme (DDP) and certain Designated Hill Areas (DHA) identified in consultation with State Governments for special focus, with respect to improvement of the PDS infrastructure.

### Efforts to Reform the PDS

The PDS's many shortcomings have been acknowledged by representatives of governmental, non-governmental, and international agencies, though the emphasis has varied considerably, as have the recommendations for reform. Efforts to improve the system – on both a general basis and through piecemeal experimentation – have been undertaken almost since the system came into being. The reform agenda has broadened and become more intense during the last ten years. Reform efforts fall into three main categories: (1) restructuring of oversight mechanisms, (2) targeting of benefits, and (3) experimentation with voucher systems.

### Conclusion

Regardless of its problems, the Public Distribution System (PDS) is widely considered an essential element of a multi-pronged strategy to both alleviate and reduce poverty. Indeed, the PDS is a critical resource for the food security of the poor, and particularly women, who manage household food supplies. In the wake of economic reforms, the PDS is perceived to be the main safety net to protect the poor from potential short-run price-induced adverse effects of economic reforms.



## A Study project on Performance of Public Distribution System with Reference to selected villages

### INTRODUCTION

Food production has increased more steadfastly than population, which has been evidenced through scientific research. Against this, reality hunger still persists in many parts of the world. Food Security stands as a fundamental need, basic to all human needs and organization of human life. In order to meet the onerous responsibility of providing food security to its citizens, the country has launched a host of programmes to increase production of food grains, generate employment to increase income level of families and to meet the nutritional needs of vulnerable groups. But, in spite of all Governmental efforts, the country has one of the highest levels of malnutrition in the world and there are reports of hunger and starvation deaths from different parts of the country. The concept of food security is interlinked with a number of related factors such as agricultural policy, nutritional policy, access to education, health care, potable drinking water, sanitation, employment security, social security and the system of public distribution through fair price shops. The root of food security through PDS goes to Kautilyan Arthashastra. According to Kautilya social security was both a private and a state matter. The history behind introduction of the PDS in India is rooted in famines and food scarcities during the entire period of British colonial rule in the most important medium through which the Government ensures food security at the micro-level is the Public Distribution System. The objectives of the Government of India's food security policy are, (i) Ensuring adequacy or efficiency in supply of food grains, and (ii) Distributing food grains at an affordable price. Major commodities distributed include staple food grains, such as wheat, rice, sugar and pulses, through a network of public distribution shops (also known as ration shops) established in several states across the country at reasonable prices. Tamil Nadu sets a model in implementing the PDS as universal system for the cause of eradicating poverty and improving standard of living of the people living below the poverty line.

- To evaluate the issues related to access, utilization and perception of PDS among APL and BPL beneficiaries in the study area and

## RESEARCH METHODOLOGY

The study is based on primary and secondary data. Primary data was collected with the help of questionnaires from samples selected from respective populations with appropriate sampling design. For the purpose of the study, the sample size of 50 beneficiaries of public distribution system in the study area has been conveniently selected and studied. The secondary data has been collected from books, journals, magazine, newspaper, periodicals, reports and websites.

The Table No. 1 shows that the study reveals that 26 per cent of the sample respondents belong to the age group of between 30-40 years. The study found that majority of the respondents in the sample area were illiterates (28 per cent) and 22 per cent (11 respondents) had completed primary education, 20 per cent (10 respondents) had completed secondary school level, 12 per cent (16 respondents) were graduates. The study reveals that majority of the sample respondents 36 per cent (18 respondents) were daily wage earners. The study found out that only 12 per cent of the respondents belong to income group above 50000.

The above Table No.2 shows, it was found that out of the total sample 64 per cent of the respondents belong to the BPL type of card. The study revealed that 92 per cent of the respondents used card for self-consumption purposes and 8 per cent alone used their card for a third person without any monetary obligation. It was found that 84 per cent of the respondents were regular in their monthly PDS purchase. Out of the sample respondents 2 per cent occasionally purchases from PDS and it was observed due to reasons like unwillingness to purchase due to poor quality and to avoid card getting terminated.

## CONCLUSION

Rationing was introduced in India as a food control during the Second World War but has since become a permanent feature of our economy as clearly stated in this study. Today the PDS is intended not only to ensure adequate and timely availability of essential commodities to people in the rural and urban areas, particularly the weaker section. This study presented information about the PDS, details of its working, network, access, and utilization and satisfaction of family card holders towards PDS in the study area. The prime aim of PDS is to ensure adequate supply of essential commodities of acceptable quality at an affordable price to the general public, particularly the poor. It is true that PDS has achieved greatly in its objectives. But over the decades, its functioning has suffered due to inefficient management. The main aim of the government is to pass on huge amount of subsidy to the intended people for the intended purpose at low cost. In order to ensure greater efficiency concentration must be made on Targeted Public Distribution System and also application of computer, network technology along with a vigilant administration can equip government better to face the challenge successfully.

## Suggestion

- A monitoring mechanism, through the effective involvement of not only panchayat members but also other sections of society, such as members of youth clubs, self-help groups and Mahila Mandals, need to be evolved.
- This would prevent exclusion of genuine beneficiaries, proper functioning of the fair price shops and control diversion of food grains.
- Information must reach the cardholders well in advance per period regarding arrival and distribution of items through the FPSs
- There has to be regular distribution of oil and pulses allotment very month and quantity allotted should be sufficient.
- Quality of items released from the Supply Department for distribution through FPSs should be improved.

- Late delivery of items should be made regular. The full monthly quota of food grains must reach the Fair Price Shops within seven days of a month to ensure and enable the family card holders to get their entitlements at right time.
- The role of vigilance committees should be made transparent, accountable and responsible for proper and efficient working of PDS. This can be done by appointing independent Regulator/Ombudsman.
- A local committee may be constituted consisting of members of the local body, representative of the family card holders and members of consumer forums for ever
- Fair Price Shops and entrusted with the responsibilities to supervise their working and may be given sufficient powers to handle the local problems.
- Computerization of ration card data for proper distribution and to check leakages should be adopted. This can reduce malpractices in allotment to a greater extent.
- Careful attention needs to be paid to E<sub>1</sub> mistakes and I mistakes while selecting beneficiaries of BPL, APL categories.
- In addition to supply of essential consumable commodities at FPS, agricultural inputs like improved seeds, fertilizers etc. may also be made available to the farmers which would be very helpful for them to access, as they may purchase the inputs along with commodities under PDS.
- Family card holders must be made aware of Online Grievance Registration System, District Dispute Redressal; Forum, authorities responsible to address their grievances and so on. Awareness campaign in this regard may be carried out in routine manner.

Proper training should be provided to women for better results

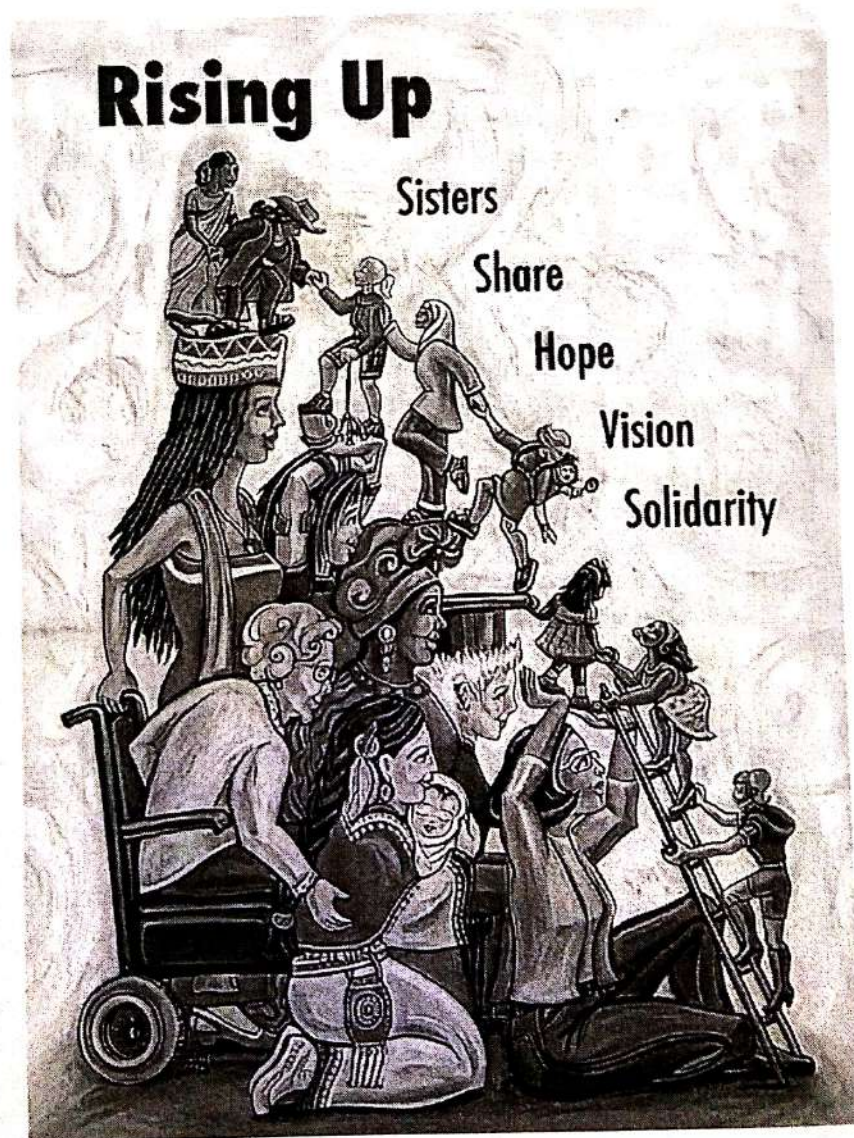
### Create more part time job opportunities

## A Study project on Performance of Public Distribution System with Reference to selected villages

### INTRODUCTION

Food production has increased more steadfastly than population, which has been evidenced through scientific research. Against this, reality hunger still persists in many parts of the world. Food Security stands as a fundamental need, basic to all human needs and organization of human life. In order to meet the onerous responsibility of providing food security to its citizens, the country has launched a host of programmes to increase production of food grains, generate employment to increase income level of families and to meet the nutritional needs of vulnerable groups. But, in spite of all Governmental efforts, the country has one of the highest levels of malnutrition in the world and there are reports of hunger and starvation deaths from different parts of the country. The concept of food security is interlinked with a number of related factors such as agricultural policy, nutritional policy, access to education, health care, potable drinking water, sanitation, employment security, social security and the system of public distribution through fair price shops. The root of food security through PDS goes to Kautilyan Arthashastra. According to Kautilya social security was both a private and a state matter. The history behind introduction of the PDS in India is rooted in famines and food scarcities during the entire period of British colonial rule in the most important medium through which the Government ensures food security at the micro-level is the Public Distribution System. The objectives of the Government of India's food security policy are, (i) Ensuring adequacy or sufficiency in supply of food grains, and (ii) Distributing food grains at an affordable price. Major commodities distributed include staple food grains, such as wheat, rice, sugar and kerosene, through a network of public distribution shops (also known as ration shops) established in several states across the country at reasonable prices. Tamil Nadu sets a model in implementing the PDS as universal system for the cause of eradicating poverty and improving standard of living of the people living below the poverty line.

- To study the socio- economic conditions of rural population brought under PDS in the study area
- To evaluate the issues related to access, utilization and perception of PDS among APL and BPL beneficiaries in the study area and



## RESEARCH METHODOLOGY

The study is based on primary and secondary data. Primary data was collected with the help of questionnaires from samples selected from respective populations with appropriate sampling design. For the purpose of the study, the sample size of 50 beneficiaries of public distribution system in the study area has been conveniently selected and studied. The secondary data has been collected from books, journals, magazines, newspaper, periodicals, reports and websites.

The Table No. 1 shows that the study reveals that 26 per cent of the sample respondents belong to the age group of between 30-40 years. The study found that majority of the respondents in the sample area were illiterates (28 per cent) and 22 per cent (11 respondents) had completed primary education, 20 per cent (10 respondents) had completed secondary school level, 12 per cent (16 respondents) were graduates. The study reveals that majority of the sample respondents 36 per cent (18 respondents) were daily wage earners. The study found out that only 4 per cent of the respondents belong to income group above 50000.

The above Table No.2 shows, it was found that out of the total sample 64 per cent of the respondents belong to the BPL type of card. The study revealed that 92 per cent of the respondents used card for self-consumption purposes and 8 per cent alone used their card for a third person without any monetary obligation. It was found that 84 per cent of the respondents were regular in their monthly PDS purchase. Out of the sample respondents 2 per cent occasionally purchases from PDS and it was observed due to reasons like unwillingness to purchase due to poor quality and to avoid card getting terminated.

## CONCLUSION

Rationing was introduced in India as a food control during the *Second World War* but has come to stay as a permanent feature of our economy as clearly stated in this study. Today the PDS is intended not only to ensure adequate and timely availability of essential commodities to people in the rural and urban areas, particularly the weaker section. This study presented information about the PDS, details of its working, network, access, and utilization and satisfaction of family card holders towards PDS in the study area. The prime aim of PDS is to ensure adequate supply of essential commodities of acceptable quality at an affordable price to general public, particularly the poor. It is true that PDS has achieved greatly in its objectives. But over the decades, its functioning has suffered due to inefficient management. The main aim of the government is pass on huge amount of subsidy it sanctions to the intended people for the intended purpose at low cost. In order to ensure greater efficiency concentration must be made on Targeted Public Distribution System and also application of computer, network technology along with a vigilant administration can equip government better to face the challenge successfully.

## Suggestion

- A monitoring mechanism, through the effective involvement of not only panchayat members but also other sections of society, such as members of youth clubs, self-help groups and MahilaMandals, need to be evolved.
- This would prevent exclusion of genuine beneficiaries, proper functioning of the fair price shops and control diversion of food grains.
- Information must reach the cardholders well in advance per period regarding arrival and distribution of items through the FPSs
- There has to be regular distribution of oil and pulses allotment very month and quantity allotted should be sufficient.
- Quality of items released from the Supply Department for distribution through FPSs should be improved.

- Late delivery of items should be made regular. The full monthly quota of food grains must reach the Fair Price Shops within seven days of a month to ensure and enable the family card holders to get their entitlements at right time.
- The role of vigilance committees should be made transparent, accountable and responsible for proper and efficient working of PDS. This can be done by appointing independent Regulator/Ombudsman.
- A local committee may be constituted consisting of members of the local body, representative of the family card holders and members of consumer forums for ever
- Fair Price Shops and entrusted with the responsibilities to supervise their working and may be given sufficient powers to handle the local problems.
- Computerization of ration card data for proper distribution and to check leakages should be adopted. This can reduce malpractices in allotment to a greater extend.
- Careful attention needs to be paid to E" mistakes and I mistakes while selecting beneficiaries of BPL, APL categories.
- In addition to supply of essential consumable commodities at FPS, agricultural inputs like improved seeds, fertilizers etc. may also be made available to the farmers which would be very helpful for them to access, as they may purchase the inputs along with commodities under PDS.
- Family card holders must be made aware of Online Grievance Registration System, District Dispute Redressal; Forum, authorities responsible to address their grievances and so on. Awareness campaign in this regard may be carried out in routine manner.
